# A LEGENDARY VALLEY AT THE CROSSROADS OF 3 COUNTRIES



The Chamonix valley is located at the foot of the exceptional Mont-Blanc massif. On the borders of Switzerland and Italy, it extends over 28km from west to east and englobes the resorts of Servoz, Houches, Chamonix-Mont-Blanc, Argentière and Vallorcine.

Authentic **SERVOZ**, with its pastoral architecture, opens the doors to the valley.

**LES HOUCHES,** is a family village resort, with an unrivalled panorama of the Chamonix "Aiguilles" and its famous black slope «la Verte des Houches», which hosted two men's downhill World Cup events in January 2021.

**CHAMONIX-MONT-BLANC,** ski and mountaineering capital, is a vibrant alpine town which has preserved its unique architectural heritage, witness to a long and rich history.

**ARGENTIÈRE,** with the famous Grands Montets ski area, is a favorite spot for freeriders and ski lovers from all over the world. And finally, **VALLORCINE**, the most "natural" of the villages in the valley, located on the border with Switzerland, is perfect for those seeking a winter retreat that allies sport and contemplation.

Extending over 4 major ski domains, the slopes of the Chamonix valley are located above 2000 m altitude, which ensures optimum snow quality. For those who prefer walks, 20 km of marked trails are available in winter. Several complete circuits offer walkers the opportunity to discover winter alpine nature in its diversity. Many other mountain activities are offered in the valley: paragliding, Nordic skiing, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing...

For contemplatives and non-skiers, the Aiguille du Midi cable car transports its passengers in just twenty minutes to the realms of high mountains. At an altitude of 3,842m the panoramas of Mont Blanc and the Alps are unforgettable. Visitors of all ages can also discover the famous Mer de Glace site (1913m) by taking the little Montenvers train or embark on the Mont-Blanc tramway (1794m) to discover the panorama of the Bionassay glacier. The valley also has outstanding indoor sports facilities open year round: swimming pool, skating rink, tennis, squash and climbing wall.

For après-ski, window-shopping enthusiasts can take advantage of the many boutiques and shops open Monday to Sunday, plus a varied choice of restaurants, ranging from traditional fare to haute cuisine. As for night birds, the cosmopolitan and lively atmosphere in Chamonix centre is highly contagious. For those seeking relaxation and well-being, our top-of-the-range spas have gained international renown!

# **MUST SEE**

# RUB SHOULDERS WITH THE GIANTS AT THE AIGUILLE DU MIDI

Inaugurated in 1955, the Aiguille du Midi cable car reaches the dizzy height of 3842 m. From the centre of Chamonix, it allows access to the high mountains in 20 minutes, and offers its visitors a grandiose panorama of the Mont-Blanc massif and the surrounding Alps. The intrepid can take the 'Step into the Void®'. This attraction is a feat of architectural and technical prowess: a glass cage 2.50 m long, suspended above 1000 m of void.



# LEGENDARY SKIING THE VALLEY BLANCHE

Accessible from the Aiguille du Midi, the Vallée Blanche is one of the greatest glacier descents in Europe. This unmarked off-piste route of 20 km and 2000 m vertical drop, allows experienced skiers to discover an exceptional setting, surrounded by legendary peaks, whilst descending the Glacier du Géant and the famous Mer de Glace... # **4 SKI AREAS ON 4 MOUNTAIN SIDES**

The Chamonix-Mont-Blanc valley offers a little over 110 km of marked downhill trails, 90% of which are located at an altitude of 2000 m and above. There are also 50 km of marked trails for cross-country skiing. Chamonix attracts some of the world's best skiers and snowboarders, and the reputation of the Grands Montets and the Vallée Blanche is far reaching. But the valley also offers several areas for intermediate and beginner skiers. The season starts late November and ends in early May, with excellent spring skiing conditions.

# LES HOUCHES (1008m - 1900m)

Located at the entrance to the Chamonix valley, this is an ideal area for family skiing. There are many picturesque, gentle, tree-lined slopes and the views over the Mont-Blanc Massif and the Aravis mountain range are superb. The area also has some technical descents, not least the famous «Verte des Houches», the Downhill World Cup slope which regularly hosts international competitions, namely the Kandahar.





# **BRÉVENT - FLÉGÈRE (2525m)**

Facing the Mont Blanc range, with a sunny exposition, the Brévent - Flégère ski area offers incredible panoramic views and a variety of slopes suitable for all types of skier and levels of expertise.



Partially located on a glacier, this ski area covers three mountainsides (the Argentière glacier, Lognan and the Pendant) and offers a vast range of on and off-piste skiing with tremendous vertical drop. It is a popular departure point for ski touring.





# BALME - LE TOUR (2270m)

The snow-covered mountain pastures of Balme can be reached both from the village of Le Tour and from Vallorcine. Wide and gentle sunny slopes offer exceptional views of the Mont-Blanc Massif and on the Vallorcine side, tree-lined descents with many variants appeal to all levels of skier.


# **RECONSTRUCTION OF THE GRANDS MONTETS**

Following the fire that ravaged the Grands Montets in 2018, the redevelopment of the future lifts and site is guided by a long-term vision for this unique high-mountain site. The municipality of Chamonix continues to work closely with the lift operator (Compagnie du Mont-Blanc) in laying down the specifications for this ambitious project. Both parties rely on the guidance and expertise of <a href="AdaPT Mont-Blanc">AdaPT Mont-Blanc</a> Mont-Blanc with regards to the geology of the site, the stability of permafrost and the project's environmental impact.

The Lognan plateau at the mid-station will be less imposing than the former station, even though it will still accommodate the two lift stations, reception areas and customer services. The top Grands Montets station, located on a classified site, will be positioned slightly lower than the existing one, thus providing direct access to the Col des Grands Montets. With regards to reaching the Grands Montets ski area, priority will be given to public transport and soft mobility. The existing car park will be landscaped to make it more visually attractive and integrated into its surroundings. This project is a golden opportunity for the community to rethink the entire base station area, improving transport links with the outlying hamlets and a better access from Argentière railway station and village.

Opening scheduled for 2024.





# NEW LE TOUR Charamillon Gondola Lift (Balme Ski Area)

Work to replace the Charamillon gondola lift began in spring 2021 with the construction of the upper station. Work has continued throughout 2021, but the construction site will be put on hold during the winter of 2021-2022 and the ski area will be accessible as usual. The reconstruction of the lower station and the development of the surrounding area is scheduled from spring 2022, which means the existing lift will not be operating in summer 2022. The future installation will have 39 cabins with 10 places, making it possible to transport 2,200 people/hour (compared to 1,004 at present). The new cabins will cover the 376m vertical drop in 5.26 minutes, at a speed of 6m/second.

The new gondola will open in December 2022.



# **MONTENVERS SITE - MER DE GLACE:** HISTORY IN THE MAKING

Explored for the first time by William Windham and Richard Pococke in 1741, La Mer de Glace, the largest French glacier, is a living witness to the climate changes of our time.

In order to preserve and enhance the memory of this emblematic site, the Municipal Council of Chamonix has approved an investment programme of over than 53 million euros. 25 million of the budget will be allocated to the construction of a new cable car which will facilitate access on and off the glacier for visitors, alpinists and skiers arriving from the Vallée Blanche. More than 20 million of the budget will be allocated to the construction of a Glacier and Climate Interpretation Center, the objective of which is to inform and educate visitors about climate change.

For the implementation of this project, a 33-year public service concession contract was signed in June 2021 with Compagnie de la Mer de Glace. This newly formed company is held by the Compagnie du Mont Blanc (60%). the Caisse des Dépôts et des Consignations (30%) and the Crédit Agricole des Savoie bank (10%).

### An ambitious programme for an exceptional site which will aim to:

- Preserve and enhance the memory of a pioneering site in the history glacier discovery and access to high mountains.
- Protect both the heritage and the landscape.
- Inform and educate visitors about climate change and its impact on the Mer de Glace glacier.
- Improve the quality of visitor's experience in terms of site discovery and access to the glacier.
- Ensure the strictest respect for the natural site of Montenvers (architecture and technical integration).

### THE MAJOR STAGES OF THE PROJECT:

- December 2023, opening of the new Mer de Glace cable car
- December 2024, opening of the «Glaciorium» Climate and Glacier Interpretation Centre

# **SKI TOURING: ON THE UP!**



Over the past few years in the Chamonix Valley, ski touring has become more and more popular. In order to facilitate training and practice, there are now four marked routes of different lengths and difficulty. After the effort, the reward is a gentle ski down the slopes!

Four marked itinerairies (not patrolled) for different levels of ski tourers. Descent via the ski slopes.

- LES HOUCHES / Prarion : elevation 841 metres
- ARGENTIÈRE / Lognan par La Trapette (not recommended for beginners) elevation 730 metres
- ARGENTIÈRE / Refuge de Lognan : elevation 800 metres
- LE TOUR / Charamillon : elevation 358 metres

# LA CHAMONIARDE

The Chamoniarde is a mountain rescue and prevention association which organizes courses for adults to raise mountain safety awareness.

Weekend ski touring courses enable customers to acquire better knowledge of the mountains in order to gain autonomy and better awareness of potential risks.

# TRAILS THROUGHOUT THE VALLEY

Today, the Chamonix-Mont-Blanc valley has a Nordic ski area of about fifty kilometres – both classic and skating pistes – in the resorts of Les Houches, Chamonix, Argentière and Vallorcine.

A detailed map of cross-country skiing trails is available at tourist offices or cross-country ski centres throughout the valley.

# FREE NOCTURNAL SESSIONS ON THURSDAYS

Beginning in December, the green track of the Bois du Bouchet is free for evening sessions from 18:30 to 20:30. The track is not floodlit so headlamps are recommended.

# ON THE TRACKS ...

The first ever Winter Olympic Games took place in Chamonix from 25 January to 5 February 1924. At the time, downhill skiing had not gained momentum or recognition. Only six sports were on the Olympic programme: ice-hockey, ice-skating, speed skating, curling, bobsleigh and skiing of course, but not downhill! The Olympic ski disciplines were cross-country (50km and 18km), ski jumping, combined (jumping and cross-country) and a 30km military four per team race where they shot with real bullets.





# CHAMONIX MONT-BLANC VALLEY: AN EXCEPTIONAL NATURAL, CULTURAL AND SCIENTIFIC HERITAGE THAT THE COMMUNITY CONSERVES AND STRENGTHENS!

The territory of Mont Blanc has constantly evolved between the 18th and the 21st century. Initially, a rural area that was difficult to access and faced with many natural risks, the advent of tourism changed the dynamics. The emergence of mountaineering and winter sports created an economic boom and the mountain was progressively developed and equipped. Understanding this evolution provides the keys to the Mont-Blanc landscape and the challenges we face today. The objectives of the Chamonix Valley today are to analyze the links between our natural, cultural and scientific heritage and to establish networks with the main actors and mountain professionals. The role of our cultural and scientific sites is primordial in this collaboration.



# THE MUSEUM NETWORK

### THE NEW CRYSTAL MUSEUM

### THE ALPINE MUSEUM

Classified museum of France, occupies a historic building in the heart of Chamonix since 1969. The museum, endowed with a collection of more than 15,000 objects, is embarking on a complete renovation project, to become the Mont Blanc Museum: creation of 3 permanent exhibition spaces and one temporary exhibition space, new museography, new

mediation mechanisms, and significant digital development. As the only mountain museum in France, its objective will be to highlight the interactions between Man and the mountain in the Mont-Blanc region whilst showcasing extraordinary collections.

# A WORLD UNIQUE GLACIORIUM AT THE MONTENVERS SITE

(opening winter 2024-2025) The Interpretation Glacier and Climate Centre to be built on the Montenvers-Mer de Glace site will invite each visitor to an immersive experience in the world of glaciers and their history.

Located at the arrival station of the legendary cog railway, this centre will dive into the heart of the glacier. Interactivity and emotions guaranteed on a unique explorative journey: history of the site, anatomy of an ice giant, scientific study of a hidden world, climate observatory ...

# THE CHAMONIX VALLEY CRYSTAL MUSEUM



# ONE OF THE MOST BEAUTIFUL MINERALOGICAL MUSEUMS IN FRANCE

### **Opening October 2021**

The crystal museum of the Community of Communes of the Chamonix Valley, located in the Espace Tairraz, will reopen to the public this autumn after having benefited from a major expansion. Thanks to the legacy of Michel Jouty's mineralogical collection to the city of Chamonix, and that of the Ducarre collection to the Mineralogy Club of Chamonix, the Crystal Museum will now exhibit an extraordinary compilation of Alpine and indeed global rock minerals and gems. It invites visitors to discover the centuries-old tradition of quartz harvesting in the Mont-Blanc Massif, a tradition which is still alive today. The crystal-seekers were the first mountaineers in the valley; not only did they reveal the extraordinary natural resources of the Mont-Blanc massif but they gave their support to scientists in the 18th century and henceforth.

Among the major exhibits of the museum, we find an exceptional collection of pink and red fluorites from Mont-Blanc, an Alpine treasure unique in the world. There is also a rich variety of minerals from the Alpine Arc, making this dedicated exhibition a point of excellence of international level. The museum also invites visitors to explore the extraordinary mineralogical diversity of France, with major pieces such as azurites and malachites from Chessy-les-Mines (Rhône). The visit continues with a superb colourful world tour of minerals from five continents. Specimens from China and America are particularly well represented. A selection of African minerals also makes up a remarkable unity. The tour ends in Australia.

# New: A dedicated area entitled «Treasure» presents gems, precious stones, rough or cut, and noble metals (gold, silver, copper).

Temporary exhibitions will be regularly presented to complete the ensemble: the first is dedicated to the Jewels of the Italian Alps.

Covering an area of 700 m², the number of exhibits has tripled in comparison with the previous Crystal Museum. There are now nearly 1,500 specimens that will astonish and dazzle collectors, enthusiasts and the general public alike. The expansion and refurbishments have cost over 2 million euros and this new exhibition centre now ranks as one of the finest national mineralogical museums.





# **CULTURE AND EXHIBITIONS**

# **CHAGALL IN LES HOUCHES**

Considered one of the most famous painters and engravers of the 20th century, Marc Chagall made his first visit to Les Houches, in the Chamonix valley, in the winter of 1926/1927. This encounter with the mountains and his discovery of Baroque art in the Pays de Savoie was a revelation for him.

Thanks to the research carried out by the former Chamonix journalist Jean-Paul Roudier, it appears that between 1927 and 1930, Chagall produced six paintings inspired by his visit to the Chamonix Valley, three of which illustrate the Saint-Jean-Baptiste church of les Houches, one the Griaz chapel, one Montquarts chapel and another featuring the Sainte-Marie viaduct.

At the initiative of Les Houches municipality in collaboration with local heritage associations, an exhibition trail entitled "Passage Chagall" was inaugurated this autumn 2021 next to the church of Les Houches, in the heart of the village. This outdoor cultural space aims to promote one annual theme, always related to local heritage.

This winter, visitors will be able to discover 4 panels presenting reproductions of Chagall's works inspired by his stay in the valley, alongside old views of the historic buildings represented, from the collection of the Musée Montagnard des Houches.

# THE NEW CULTURAL VENUE - MICHEL CROZ EMC2



# **CLAUDE D'HAM, ARTIST AND PAINTER**





Originally from Chamonix, Claude'HAM began her artistic career as a textile designer for the prestigious Guichard silk workshops in Lyon, then as an illustrator of children's books for 10 years.

Since 1968, her workshop is located in an adorable little chalet in the hamlet of Les Pélerins, facing the Mont-Blanc range and the Bossons glacier.

She now enjoys composing series of small themed paintings, always strongly inspired by the fantasy world of childhood and has presented 3 exhibitions in recent years, in the Chamonix Valley.

A first series «Children of the World», exhibited in 2015, was treated in an ethnic and colorful spirit. A second, "Cham Rétro", exhibited in 2017, had for theme a trip down memory lane, in the sepia colours of old photos. In July 2021, the exhibition of the «Bulle marine» series was a tribute Brittany. And with «Le Temps des Confitures», Claude d'HAM was back with childhood memories of picking wild fruit, her favorite theme.

# A LONG AND INSPIRING HISTORY...



The year 1741 remains an important date in the history of the Chamonix valley, for it was when two Englishmen first visited this small market town at the foot of Mont-Blanc changing its destiny forever and creating a summer craze, which was to last close to 170 years; that of visiting its famous glacier 'la Mer de Glace'.

The conquest of Mont Blanc by Jacques Balmat and Michel-Gabriel Paccard in 1786 demystified the peaks dominating the valley and forever sealed the destiny of this small mountain village, whose inhabitants had previous lived as peasant farmers. The railway arrived in the valley in 1901 marking yet another turning point in the developing trend of tourism, accompanied by the emergence of grander and more comfortable hotels.

The famous Montenvers train was inaugurated in 1909 and the first ever winter Olympic Games were organised in Chamonix in 1924, contributing to the development of winter sports in the valley.

From the 1920s onwards, many ski lifts were built: the Glacier, Planpraz, Bellevue in les Houches and later in 1955 the world-famous Aiguille du Midi cable car.
